> EDUCATION TOUR REPORT ACADEMIC SESSION 2018-2019





On 20th February 2019, the English Department of Gangadharpur Mahavidyamandir, Howrah, organized an educational tour to the Indian Museum in Kolkata. The visit was aimed at providing students with a broader cultural and historical perspective to complement their academic studies.
