REPORT ON WRITING WORKSHOP

The English language writing workshop conducted by Dr. Anurima Chanda from Ashoka University, addressed the critical needs of students struggling with various aspects of English communication. A significant focus was placed on enhancing spoken English fluency and improving articulation, essential skills for confidently facing interviews and actively participating in group discussions. Many students lacked confidence in their spoken English, a barrier the workshop aimed to break down through practical exercises and encouraging a supportive environment. Furthermore, the workshop dedicated attention to strengthening the students' grasp of grammar, a foundational element for both spoken and written communication. Recognizing the importance of formal communication, the curriculum also covered nuances in formal writing, equipping students with the skills to articulate themselves effectively in professional context.



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Dr. Anurima Chanda, from Ashoka University, who conducted the Writing Workshop, advised students to embrace consistent and deliberate practice, strategically targeting their identified weaknesses in fluency, interviews, group discussions, confidence, and grammar. She emphasized that active immersion in the language through various media, coupled with seeking regular feedback, is crucial. Dr. Chanda also highlighted the importance of shifting the focus towards communicative competence and developing strong listening skills. Furthermore, she suggested expanding vocabulary contextually, consciously practicing articulation, preparing thoroughly for communicative situations, and cultivating a growth mindset as key for sustained improvement. Ultimately, Dr. Chanda encouraged students to view English as a valuable tool for lifelong learning and to actively engage with the language and its cultural nuances, which will lead to greater fluency, confidence, and the ability to express oneself authentically.
