The teams arrived to the location at 11a.m and the camp was inaugurated with a welcome address by Dr. Debes Kumar Acharyya, TIC, Gangadharpur Mahavidyamandir. Many students participated in the camp thanks to wide publicity by NSS volunteers. In total 193 students attended the medical camp and benefitted. The medical team also arranged for free Blood Sugar Level and Blood Pressure tests which were hugely useful for many students. Nearly 140 students have undergone their general health check-ups and 53 students were benefitted with the eye check-ups. After checks up, many students were benefitted with the medicines provided with free of cost. Few of the students were referred by the doctors for further treatment at Kulai Rural Hospital. The NSS volunteers and Alumni have played a vital role in making this camp success with their dedication in serving people; they directed everyone in all needy way.
