Objectives:

The key objectives of the awareness program were:

Activities Conducted:

1. Interactive Seminars and Workshops: - The members of ELC organized interactive seminars where students were introduced to the history and evolution of the Indian electoral process.



- Workshops included hands-on activities such as mock elections, where students could experience the voting process firsthand. Quiz Competitions: - A quiz competition was held to test the students'

- 3. Discussion Sessions with Alumni and Local Leaders: Alumni of the institution who have been actively involved in the electoral process and local leaders were invited to share their experiences. This provided students with real-world insights into the functioning of the electoral system and the impact of voting.

Impact and Observations -

- 1. Increased Awareness: The program significantly increased students' awareness of the electoral process. Many students who were previously unaware of the details of the electoral system showed a keen interest in understanding their future role as voters.

- 1. Extended Program Duration: Future programs should consider a longer duration to cover more topics in greater detail, allowing for a deeper understanding of the electoral process.
